



What is HIICAP & How Can it Help?

The Health Insurance Information, Counseling, and Assistance Program (HIICAP) provides free, accurate, and objective information, counseling, assistance, and advocacy on Medicare, private health insurance, and related health coverage plans. HIICAP also provides information on the Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC) program, Medicare savings programs, "Extra Help" prescription assistance, and pharmacy discount programs.

Here are some ways a HIICAP counselor can help:

- Compare private insurance plans
- Find affordable coverage and fill Medicare's gaps
- Understand Medicare rules and your medical bill

Let's Talk Albany: Crailo State Historic Site, 100 Years Strong

Wednesday, 11/13 at 1 p.m. at APL's Bach Branch

Crailo is an important architectural landmark and historic resource focused on the Dutch Colonial experience. This site would not exist today without the determined efforts of Susan de Lancey van Rensselaer Strong. In 1899, Susan, a descendant of Hendrick van Rensselaer (who built Crailo in 1707), purchased the badly deteriorated building, saving it from demolition. Susan also greatly contributed to research on the history of Dutch New York, Crailo, and the van Rensselaer family. Join Crailo Historic Interpreter Loretta Tucker to learn all about the history of Crailo.

Free Medicare Counseling Sessions

Medicare health and drug plans can change year-toyear, including coverage, premium, or which providers and pharmacies participate in their networks.

The annual Medicare Open Enrollment Period (October 15 - December 7) gives Medicare beneficiaries the opportunity to review their health care coverage each year and make changes to better suit their current needs. A representative from Albany

County HIICAP /NY StateWide Senior Action Council is coming to NNORC, to conduct free, confidential, one-on-one counseling sessions to help you make the right Medicare decisions during open enrollment. **NOTE:** If you have retiree group insurance (NYSHIP/EMPIRE plan, Union coverage, etc.), please contact your Benefit Plan Administrators.

The appointments will be in-person and location will be shared when the appointment is scheduled. Come prepared with a list of your medications, insurance cards/information and know your monthly income.

Occupational Therapy for Life Enrichment (OTLE) Comes to the NNORC!

Today's older adults enjoy living at home and maintaining independence. Setbacks like unplanned surgery,

illness, a fall, loss of a spouse, or simply aging, can cause a oncehappy person to become isolated or feel a lack of purpose. OTLE supports re-engagement with meaningful activities, providing any necessary adaptations to promote a sense of purpose and accomplishment.

If you...

- Lack energy or interest in activities outside the home
- Have physical or other limitations that prevent you from participating in activities or hobbies
- Spend much of the day isolated
- ...Occupational Therapy for Life Enrichment may be for you!

During an in-home visit, OTLE staff will:

- Review physical, mental, and social activities to understand strengths and limitations
- Explore small adaptations that can improve daily function
- Set goals and identify tools to uncover joy and purpose
- Help overcome barriers to make activities meaningful once again





HEAP Can Help with Winter Heating Costs

HEAP (Home Energy Assistance Program) **assists eligible New Yorkers heat or cool their homes.** This federally funded program administered by New York State helps income-eligible households meet their home energy needs.

Regular HEAP can help defray the cost of your home heating bill. With Clean and Tune, eligible households can receive cleaning of primary heating equipment, and may receive chimney cleaning, minor repairs, installation of carbon monoxide detectors or programmable thermostats. Heating Equipment Repair and Replacement helps with furnace or boiler repair or replacement.
